Region II Behavioral Health Board 2018 Year in Review

2018 Legislative Priorities:

- 1-Rural Crisis Response (RCR) was funded with funding available 7/1/18.
- 2-Medicaid Expansion--Idaho Health Care bill (Medicaid expansion hybrid) failed; Reclaim Idaho is gathering signatures to get Medicaid expansion on the ballot. The initiative was passed by voter approval on 11/6/18.
- 3-Recovery Center financial support—Rep Kingsley's bill to tax pharmaceutical companies for funding failed.
- 4-Overdose prevention law--H649 passed--MEDICAL HELP, OVERDOSE, CHARGES Provides that persons acting in good faith who are seeking or needing medical assistance for a drug-related overdose shall not be charged or prosecuted for possessing, using or being under the influence of a controlled substance.
- 5-Suicide prevention phone app—no action; H634 provides for suicide awareness and prevention training for teachers and other public school personnel.
- 6-Accelerated Resolution Therapy presented by Melanie Flowers of D7—no action
- --Our innovative Rural Crisis Response model was funded by the legislature and is designed to be a decentralized service to work with our regional hospitals to reach those in crisis and take appropriate action to stabilize them.
- --The motto, "Crisis Center for a day, Recovery Center for a lifetime" describes difference.
- --Goals for state increased funding for Substance Use Disorders, Mental Health & You phone app and Accelerated Resolution Therapy continue. Less funding available for non-criminal people.
- --BHB supported Point in Time Homeless count the last week of January.
- -- Reg 2 worked with community partners to open two Oxford Homes.
- --ICADD scholarships (\$500 ea) to Stephanie Beidman and Cathlin Stewart in May at BSU.
- --Recovery Centers received grant funding from Idaho Response to Opioid Crisis (IROC) grant through Recovery Idaho.
- --New Open mtg law requirements effective July 1—mtg announcements including subcommittees, minutes, action items.
- --State Hospital North was able to hire 3 psychiatrists after years of vacancies—declassified the positions to pay more.
- --IDHW Mental Health Awards—Regional Empowerment award—Sharlisa Davis; Regional Contribution of Honor award—Marvin Hanks.
- --Newly appointed Prevention Specialist position added by the legislature--Sharlene Johnson with term expiration of 12/31/21.
- --Suicide Prevention training through Suicide Prevention Action Network (SPAN)—Question, Persuade, Refer—QPR; Suicide Prevention Program Director, Kim Kane met with Reg 2 Board.
- --Annual Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) held in August 23-24; seek annual ongoing support from law enforcement and others.
- --Support for Latah County National Recovery month and Hands Across the Bridge in Lewiston--\$500 ea.
- --Unique and helpful outcomes from Community Patient Center Home Model—SM/CV Hospitals
- --Ongoing interest and anticipation for Youth Empowerment Services—projected 9yrs to fully implement.
- --Optum expanded telehealth for independent licensed therapist on Nov 1.
- --Rural Crisis Response project contract signed and effective on 11/1/18. Joyce Lyons hired as project coordinator.
- --Partnership for Success (PFS) signed on 11/5/18. Sharlene Johnson hired as project coordinator.
- --Reg 2 BHB voted to endorse Medicaid Expansion which voters passed on Nov 6.
- -- Subcommittee chairs appointed: Mike—nominating, Jenny—ABH, Tom L—Rural Crisis Response, Sara—Needs & Gaps, Sharlene—Prevention.
